However it is unclear how old the intelligence was and there has been some feedback that service has improved and that the problems were settling into a new contract problems. Clarence Park Surgery: Negative intelligence relating to Flu Injections not available at the surgery and the requirement to attend Locality Centre. All staff replaced and there has been four practice managers in a year. Action: To discuss with Mark Graham Chief Executive</p> <p>3.
